<p>INTRO</p>	<p>Our Challenge</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • “At the end of this program we will be making pitches to school and community leaders for projects that could make our school better.” • “Today we will doing a lot of brainstorming to help figure out our projects.” 	<p>10 min</p>
<p>SHARE</p>	<p>Student List</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • “We will start by looking at the Universal Challenges.” • “Can you come up with a specific situation when a student at our school might experience one of these. For example, a student could be experiencing loss with the death of a pet at home. Someone new to our school might experience what?” 	<p>5 min</p>
<p>NEW IDEAS</p>	<p>Place List</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • “If you were to walk around our school, are there particular places where these issues come up more. For example, where do students feel most lonely at school? Where do kids feel most judged?” 	<p>15 min</p>
<p>CLOSING ACTION</p>	<p>What Did We Find?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • “Looking at everything we talked about today, please take a moment to write down a specific issue or situation that you would like to come up with a solution for. For example, I want to work on making sure new students feel welcome at our school. We will use this as a starting point to our next session.” 	<p>10 min</p>
